



# Morgantown History

Earl Kenneth Grubb, Sr. By: Jere Brady



Earl Kenneth Grubb Sr. (Grubby) was born to Earl Henry Grubb (Poodle) and Ruth Bixler on July 11, 1924. Earl enlisted in the US Army during WWII. Over his years, he worked for Hamilton Watch Company in Lancaster. Then employed for Wright's Bakery in New Holland. Earl's father, uncle and cousin also worked at Wright's Bakery. At that time, a loaf of bread was 5 cents. When Grace Mines came to Morgantown, many locals took employment there as did Earl. He also was Road Master for Caernarvon Township. Earl served many years as Caernarvon Township Supervisor. He was very civic minded and volunteered for Friendship Fire Company and president of Caernarvon Cemetery in Morgantown. Earl died Oct. 2008. Eleanor died Oct. 9, 2009. Earl and Eleanor were both buried in Caernarvon Cemetery. Earl met Eleanor Kulp in Birdsboro, PA and were married in 1950 at the E. C. church in Reading with a reception following at the Crystal Restaurant in downtown Reading, PA. They went to Niagara Falls, NY. for their Honeymoon. Eleanor started her beauty shop in Reading (Leslie's Beauty Salon about 1948). When they moved to Morgantown, Eleanor started her beauty shop in their home. She also was employed by Hair Express, Main Street, Morgantown and Tel Hai Nursing Home Beauty Salon, Honey Brook, PA. Eleanor's parents were Luther Kulp (stepfather) and Esther Leslie Kulp. Earl and Eleanor lived and owned homes in Morgantown on Main Street next to Margie Zook's Restaurant, then to South Street and Chestnut and Mill Road then moved to West Reading and finally to Exeter, PA.

They loved to travel including the river. They cruised the Caribbean to Nova Scotia. In 1954, they attended Billy Graham Crusade at Madison Square Garden, NY. They frequently visited Jersey Shore and Atlantic City and in 1982, they attended the World's Fair, Knoxville, TN. Their Membership included Morgantown Methodist Church, Twin Valley Bible Chapel, Berkshire Baptist Church, and Frieden's Bible Chapel. Their children are Ann Louise Grubb 1949-2021; Rev. E. Kenneth Grubb (Kenny) (b.1951) married Faith A. Pollock and Vanessa Grubb (b.1955) married to Barton W. Rodgers. Grandchildren: Eric and Chad Rodgers and Paul and Lois Grubb {Pope) all now married. They had 16 great grandchildren.

# Q - Is a Use & Occupancy Certification needed with residential resale?


**A** - No, not if it is being sold as a residence. If the residence is being sold to be a rental, then a U&O is required.
